The Youth Development Center's mission is to INSPIRE, EQUIP, and GUIDE Urban Youth to LIVE



We accomplish our mission by providing an intensive after-school remediation program for 120 elementary students in grades 1 through 6 in Houston's Greater Fifth Ward. Through technology-based instruction and under the supervision of certified teachers, YDC's students improve their literacy and math skills to become more successful students.


As a result, we are helping at-risk families in predominantly Hispanic and Black communities balance career and family care while improving their child's prospects of living fulfilling lives.

Our Work In Action

For over 25 non-profit years, our organization has provided academic services for at-risk students completely free of charge. YDC is licensed through the Texas Department of Family Protective Services. Each Monday through Thursday of the academic year, our program provides the following for our students:

- Results-oriented academic development in classrooms supervised by certified teachers
- Summer enrichment programs
- Leadership training and character development
- Transportation from selected campuses to YDC and home at the end of the day
- Field trip opportunities during the school year
- Nutritious hot meals





Why Literacy?

Literacy Is Everything

According to the Children's Reading Foundation, academic. emotional and social issues are associated with poor readers. "Children who are behind their peers in reading struggle with low self-esteem and feelings inadequacy. Low achievement in reading is also the common denominator in school discipline. attendance and dropout problems, and juvenile crime."

They continue. "Academically. children who are not reading on grade level by the end of thirdgrade struggle in every class, year after vear because over percent of the curriculum is taught by reading. Reading is the skill by which students get information from books. worksheets computers, boards to learn math, science, literature, social studies and more."

YDC's accredited program helps address this problem by offering at risk students the education necessary to catch them up for a brighter future.

"Houston ISD Students Are Falling Behind In Reading."

"Less than half of Houston ISD first, second and third graders are reading at grade level, creating concern among educators about a possible domino effect that could put students behind for years.

...About 44 percent of first graders are reading on grade level at the beginning of this school year, down ten percentage points from the same time in the 2018-19 school year...

Second graders fared similarly with 46 percent reading on grade level, a four percentage loss from pre-COVID times. Third graders remained stagnant at 46 percent."

Most of our students are two to three grade levels behind in their studies when they join the YDC family. However, with decades of proven experience, our staff can guide these students to significant gains in reading and mathematics.


School Year 2021-2022 Results

3rd-6th grade students made an average gain of 1.77 grade levels in literacy

3rd-6th grade students made an average gain of .77 grade levels in math

100% of our 1st & 2ndgrade students took steps to become independent readers

YDC tracks and verifies each student's annual improvement through nationally recognized assessment testing. We administer Slosson's DST:R and DST:M at the beginning and end of each academic year.


Campus Vision
